High Explosives Science talk on September 18

On Wednesday, September 18, a new exhibit will open at the Bradbury Science Museum featuring LANL’s cradle-to-grave work with explosives. In conjunction with that opening, there will be a talk from noon to 1 p.m., that same day, on the Lab’s history with high-energy materials that date back to the Manhattan Project and how research is aiding not only the Laboratory’s national security work but industry as well.

During the talk, Cary Skidmore (with the Lab's Weapons Surety and Military Liaison Group) will describe the birth of high explosives science at Los Alamos and highlight other historical milestones the Lab has achieved in this field. Dan Hooks (with the Associate Directorate for Weapons Engineering and Experiments) will then give a basic introduction to some of the key concepts of explosives and describe how current research and development at Los Alamos continues the tradition of defining the field.
